Child Safeguarding Statement

Lucena Clinic Services is a child and adolescent mental health service run by the Hospitaller Order of St. John of God Services and funded by the HSE. It is the policy of the Lucena Clinic Services to promote the safeguarding and welfare of children and to help protect them from physical, sexual and emotional harm and neglect in compliance with the Children First Act (2015)

Lucena Clinic Services respect the confidential nature of information that children and families share with us. However there are exceptions and limits to this confidentiality. Indicators which suggest serious concern for the welfare of a child will be addressed in a fair and impartial manner and in accordance with the principles of the HSE Child Protection and Welfare Policy (2016), which have been adopted by Lucena Clinic Services.

When reports of concerns, or allegations of abuse and neglect, past or present, (including Adult reports of past abuse), are made to staff in the Clinic, these will be followed up and if reasonable grounds for concern are established, will be forwarded to the Tusla Child and Family Services for assessment and investigation.

Lucena Staff Recruitment:

All Lucena staff are appropriately recruited, selected, trained and supervised in accordance with their role and agency policy. This includes Garda clearance prior to their appointment. We also provide training to all staff in relation to our Child Protection and Welfare Policy.
